To identify the component causing the defect, compare your print sample against the measurements shown.

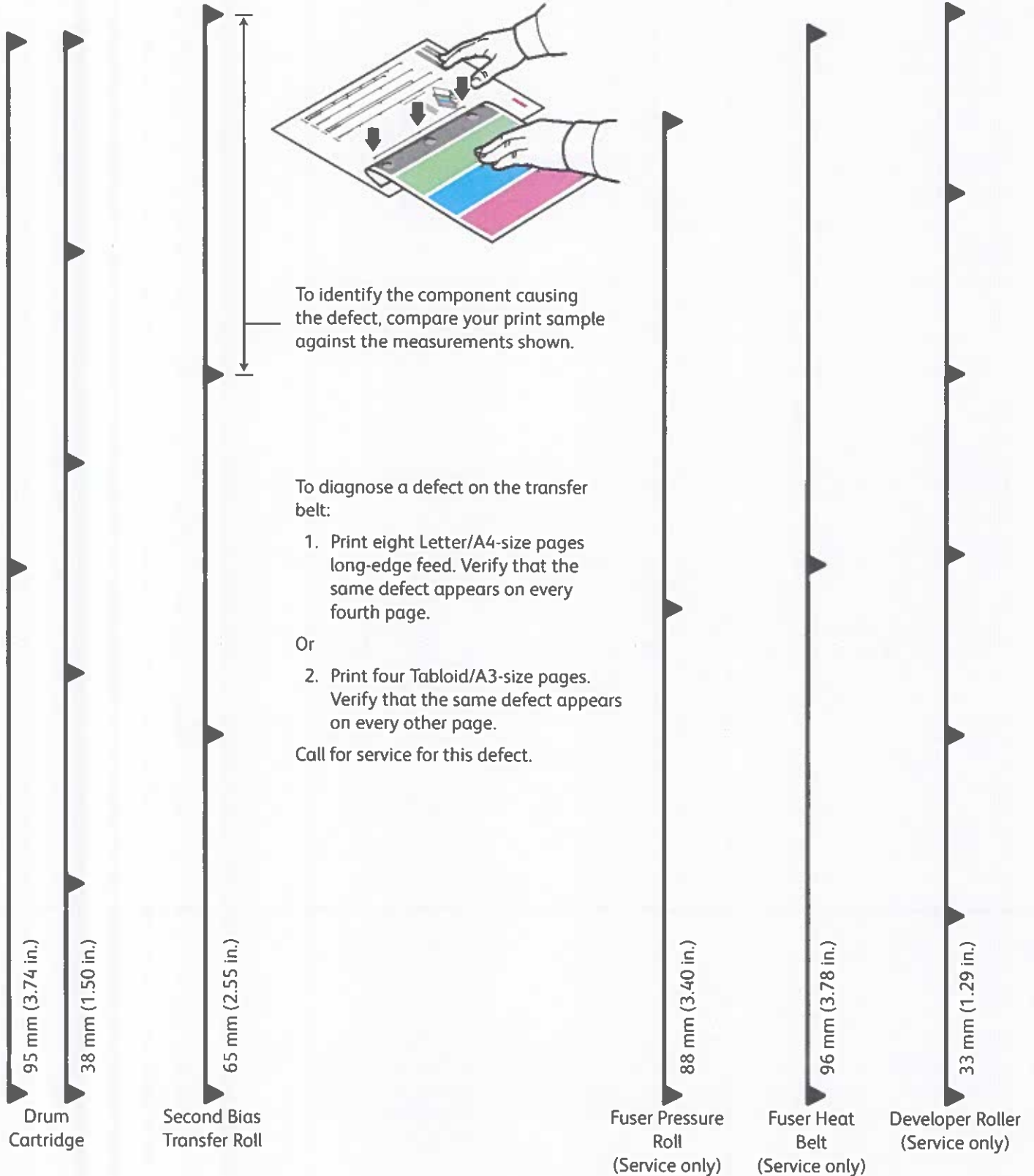
To diagnose a defect on the transfer belt:
